Whether we're gathering in our historic building, at a community center across town, or on a different continent, community is at the heart of all ASLD has to offer. This year's events, exhibits, trips, and studio improvements strengthened our connections and brought art to the lives of many.

Visual arts classes are the bread and butter of ASLD's offerings. Founded over 35 years ago with just two studios where students could learn drawing and painting skills, we now proudly offer courses in traditional media as well as printmaking, jewelry, fiber arts, ceramics, and more. Our classes cater to a range of abilities and interests - we've got something for every kind of artist.

Visiting Artist Series and Visiting Artist of Color Residency

This year we welcomed several artists to Denver as part of our Visiting Artist Series including book artist Shawn Sheehy (Chicago), painter and printmaker Jeffrey Hirst (Chicago), and printmaker Heinrich Toh (Kansas City). We also kicked off our Visiting Artist of Color Residency with ceramist Kevin Snipes from Pittsburgh for eight months. In addition to working in his private studio at ASLD, Snipes also completed an extensive project with North High ceramics students, culminating in an exhibit at ASLD in the spring.

We expanded our weekly teen offerings to include both wheel throwing and hand-building ceramics, fiber arts, and printmaking. Friday Nights at ASLD are always exciting when young artists fill our studios with imagination and bond over the creative process – and of course, snacks!

Studio Updates

In early 2022, we moved our fiber arts studio from the basement to the third floor, creating a third ceramics studio and more space for wheel throwing and hand-building opportunities for students. ASLD's entire lower level is now dedicated to ceramics, which has allowed us to increase offerings for some of our most popular courses and welcome more artists into our studios. We also added two accessible wheels, creating space for people who use wheel chairs.

We hosted *Coloring Outside the Lines*, an exhibit of artwork by youth in the ASLD community; the *ASLD Print Fair* as a part of Colorado's biennial Mo'Print month of printmaking; *Supernatural Stomping Grounds* from Artist in Residence Kevin Snipes; and *Process: Making Things on the Way to Making Other Things*, curated by local artist Rick Griffith. We also began our ongoing outdoor exhibit, *The Flagpole Project*, to visually highlight Denver and Colorado's histories that are often not told.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Our time in greater Denver and our surrounding communities is well-spent and allows our Staff and Instructors to collaborate with other individuals, businesses, and organizations to provide meaningful art experiences throughout Colorado. This past year we continued working with **The Gathering Place** by bringing art classes to adults experiencing homelessness; and with Denver's **Westwood neighborhood** through weekly youth violence-prevention-through-art classes. We also began a partnership with **Anythink Libraries** in Adams County.
